Executive Summary

Overview

Welcome to The VendorRate Report for the third calendar quarter of 2008. The VendorRate Report summarizes customer satisfaction ratings entered by technology professionals at our website, trade shows, professional conferences and virtual events. VendorRate also collects rating information in cooperation with user groups, trade associations, event management, and IT and telecom departments from organizations of all sizes. VendorRate is vendor neutral and accepts neither vendor sponsorship nor advertising.

Highlights of The VendorRate Q3 Report

- IBM’s Informix received the highest overall ranking with a score of 91
- VMware, CDW, and Apple (Desktops & Notebooks) repeated as highest rated vendors
- EMC and Microsoft (Operating Systems) repeated in lowest rated vendor listing
- Tech services industries continued to lag behind hardware and software industries in customer satisfaction
- 10 or more ratings per vendor were required to be eligible for the Top Vendor listing in Q3
- A new “Honorable Mention” section was created for companies with greater than 5 but less than 10 ratings
- IBM Servers also made the Top rated vendor list, but IBM Global Services is listed among Low rated vendors
- Both well known and lesser known brands won top honors in the Performance Category section on pages 8 and 9

Vendors rated Exceptional

Informix was the top scoring vendor for Q3, posting a summary score of 91. Informix received ratings from more than 120 organizations, indicating a high level of customer satisfaction.

Apple, CDW and VMware repeated their Q2 listing in the Exceptional rating section. Newcomers to the top rated vendor list include Quest Software and Oracle Software. Q2 top vendor ChemSW continued to receive summary scores above 90, although reduced rating volume moved them to the Honorable Mention section.

Honorable Mention

Eight vendors are listed who were rated Exceptional but did not receive the minimum 10 ratings required to make the Q3 Exceptional vendor list. Honorable Mention vendors received between 5 and 10 ratings during the period; more detailed information may be found when reading the Comments section for each vendor.
